

If you have someone else drive you to work, you need to:



Arrange who will drive you to work. This could be a family member, co-worker, neighbor, or friend.



Arrange what time you will be picked up to and from work. To do this, you will have to know how long it takes to get to your workplace. Be sure to allow time for traffic.



Arrange where you will be picked up to and from work.



Offer to pay for some of the gas that is used driving you to and from work.

Cost: Having someone drive you can be free, or you may need to pay for gas. In many cases, it is appropriate to give someone (e.g. particularly friends or co-workers) gas money because they are doing you a *big* favor.
